Korea took around 36,000. Vietnam took over fifty eight,000, their names etched into polished black stone that throws your face returned at you, a stark reminder that the residing do no longer walk away untouched. Iraq and Afghanistan collectively took greater than 7,000 lives, and the toll grows whilst you remember contractors, allied forces, and the 1000's who came dwelling however couldn't put the conflict down.

If these men got here to come back for a day, I suspect they could stroll earlier our slogans and ask harder questions. How cautious are we with the energy to penitentiary, fire, or cancel?
