

A reliable garage door safeguards your vehicle, belongings, and home while providing routine convenience. In Los Angeles, high temperatures, strong sunlight, coastal humidity, aging hardware, and regular operation can gradually wear down an overhead garage door. Prompt garage door repair and routine maintenance can help keep a small adjustment from becoming a major safety or replacement issue.

Why a Garage Door Will Not Lift or Close

If the garage door will not open, first check whether the opener has power and whether the garage door remote has working batteries. If the wall control works but the remote does not, the issue may involve programming,

interference, or the remote itself. If neither control works, the garage door motor, wiring, circuit, or opener mechanism may need inspection.

If the garage door will not close, inspect the photo-eye sensors near the bottom of the tracks. These garage door safety sensors must point toward one another and remain free of dust, cobwebs, and obstructions. Misalignment, damaged wiring, or direct sunlight can interrupt the signal. Do not bypass the sensors; they are designed to stop the door if a person, pet, or object crosses the opening.

A failed **counterbalance spring** can prevent normal movement even if the motor runs. The motor may hum while the door stays in place, or the opener may strain and shut off. Springs are under significant tension, so homeowners should not attempt to adjust them. Disconnecting the opener and manually lifting a heavy door can also create a major risk of injury.

Squeaky, Slumped, or Derailing Garage Doors

Scraping, squealing, cracking, or shaking may point to worn garage door rollers, unstable fasteners, under-lubricated hinges, damaged tracks, or not enough lubrication. Rollers that are damaged or no longer turning smoothly should usually be replaced rather than forced to operate. Garage door hinges may also become loose or deformed, especially on regularly operated sectional doors.

Garage door cables carry lifting force between the springs and the door. Damaged, loose, or poorly fitted cables require professional attention. A cable failure can cause one side of the door to sink, resulting in an off-track garage door or significant panel damage.

Garage door alignment is important for secure, even movement. A technician can check whether the tracks are even, whether the rollers sit correctly, and whether the door is evenly weighted.
