That last one is the troublemaker. Repeated water concentration near the foundation can contribute to settlement issues, seepage, and damp basement walls. I would never claim every wet basement starts with a clogged gutter, because houses are more complicated than that. But I have seen enough cases where improved drainage made a noticeable difference. It is one of the simplest preventive maintenance tasks a homeowner can stay ahead of.

Roof edges suffer too. When water cannot move through the gutter and downspout, it may back up under shingles or soak the fascia board behind the gutter. In winter, that trapped moisture can freeze, expand, and make minor weaknesses worse. Gutter spikes loosen. Seams separate. Sections pull away from the house. 3. Gutters sag, separate at seams, or pull away from the fascia.
4. Water pools near the foundation after rain.

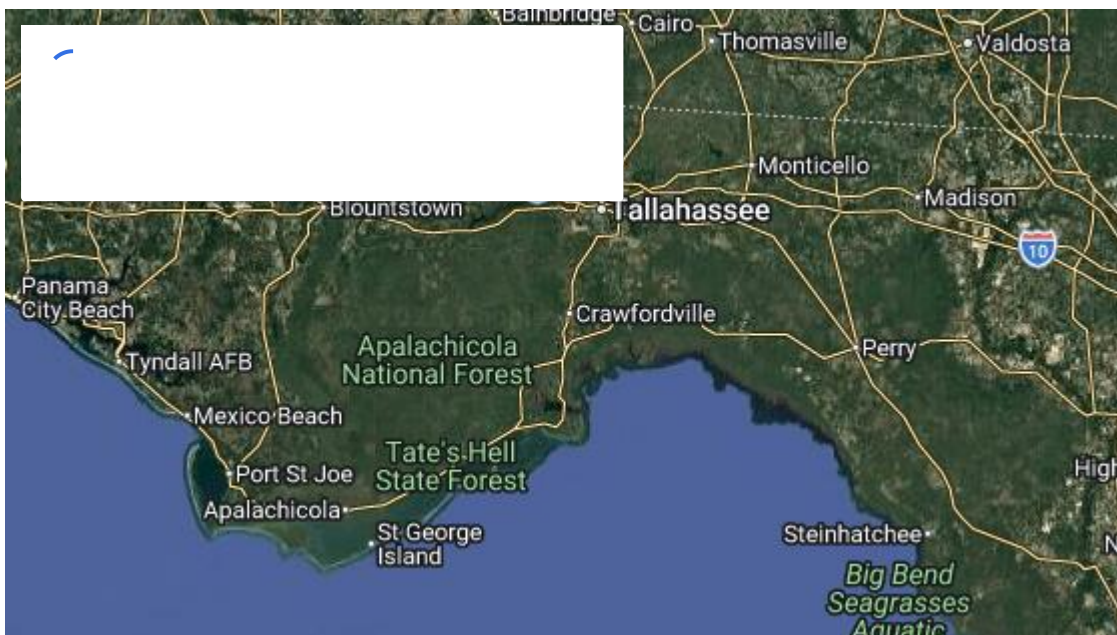
A few smart questions include:
