

What pests are most common in Brampton?

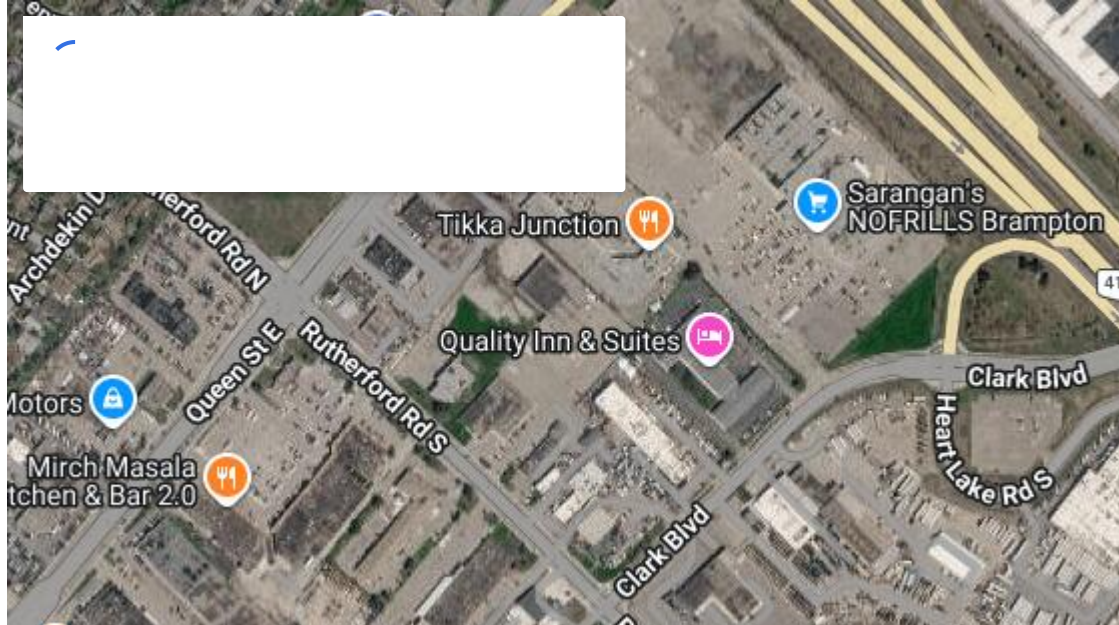
