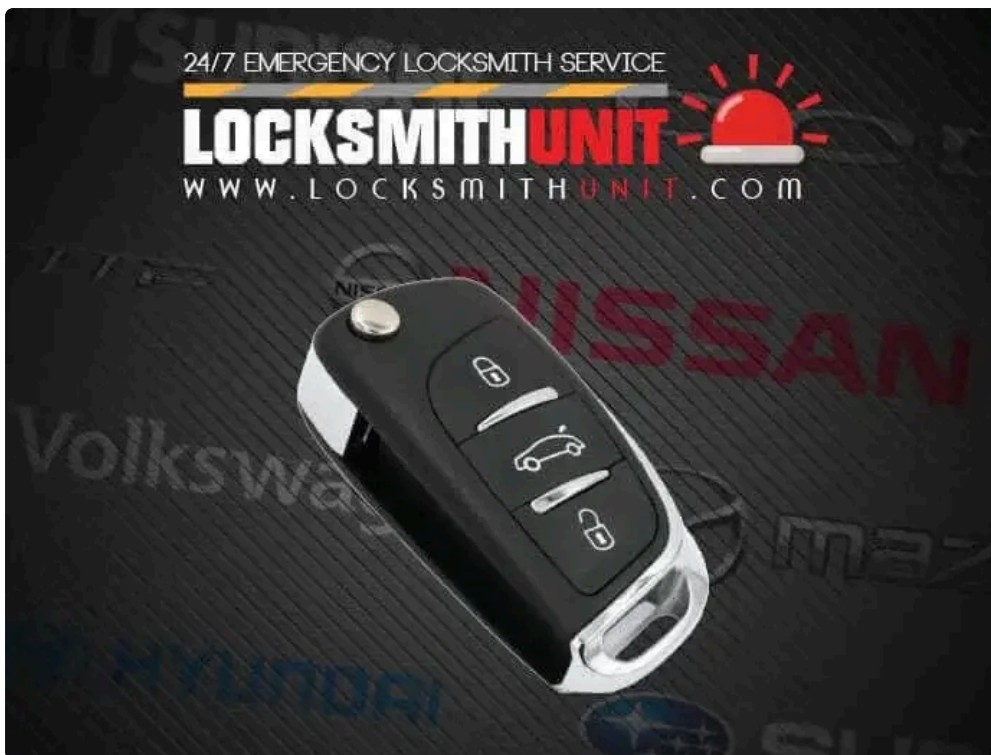
Why office lockouts feel different from house lockouts
