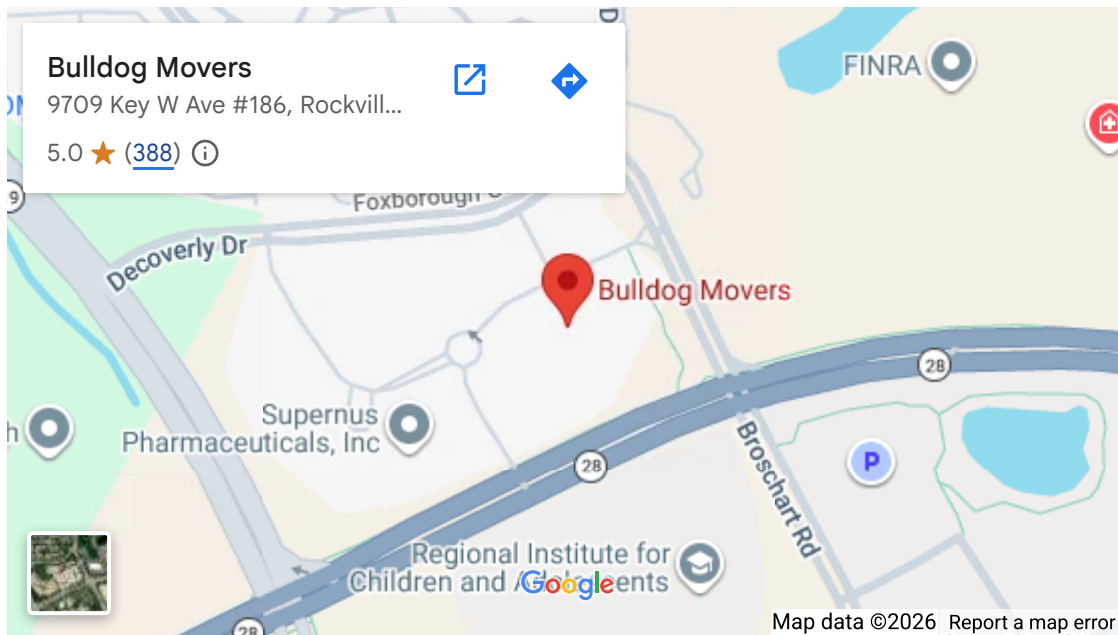

Many high-rise buildings direct moving trucks to a shared loading dock rather than street parking directly in front of the building. This often requires additional walking distance from the truck to the freight elevator, which affects the overall time needed for the move. Protecting Common Areas During the Move

Building management frequently requires moving companies to protect hallway walls, elevator interiors, and lobby flooring with padding or corner guards during the move. Communication With Building Staff

Successful high-rise moves depend on clear communication between the moving crew and building staff, including concierge, security, and maintenance personnel.
