

A bent garage door track can quickly turn a routine opening into a safety concern. If your overhead garage door is noisy, jerks as it moves, slips off the track, or halts midway, the problem may involve the track, garage door rollers, springs, cables, or opener. Prompt garage door repair can help avoid additional damage to the door panel, lifting system, and garage structure.

Ways to Identify When Your Garage Door Track Requires Service

Common warning signs include a bent garage door track, a misaligned garage door track, loose mounting brackets, rust, gaps between the rollers and track, or hardware that has pulled away from the wall.

- **Irregular movement:** One side of the overhead garage door rises faster than the other, or the door vibrates during operation.
- **Scraping or grinding:** A loud garage door may have worn garage door rollers, damaged track surfaces, or a loose bracket.

Impact from a vehicle is another typical cause in Los Angeles.
