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Columbus has a generous canopy for a Midwestern city. Maples shade Clintonville driveways, pin oaks line Upper Arlington streets, and cottonwoods extend along the Scioto. That canopy includes responsibility. Make Insurance coverage Non-Negotiable

Clarify the Scope: Removal, Trimming, and Stump Grinding
