

Garage door repair in Los Angeles can involve issues ranging from a damaged roller or off-track track to a damaged spring, damaged panel, or failed opener. The proper solution is determined by the door's age, construction, condition, and the specific access challenges at your property.

A torsion spring is mounted above the door and is frequently used on many sectional overhead doors. An extension spring is positioned along the sides of the door and lengthens while the door moves.

Replacing a spring often lands in a broad range of roughly \$200 to \$500, although limited access, large doors, more than one spring, oxidation, or premium high-cycle parts can raise the price. A broken garage door spring can leave the door dangerously heavy. If the garage door will not open, do not try to raise it again and again or remove the spring yourself. Springs store significant energy and can cause severe harm if handled incorrectly. Ask whether the estimate includes checking the garage door balance, inspecting garage door cables, replacing aging bearings or end plates, and disposing of the old spring. Replacing only one spring on a paired system may be reasonable in some situations, but a technician should explain the anticipated lifespan and condition of the remaining spring.

How Much Does a Garage Door Panel Cost to Repair or Replace?

A garage door panel may be repaired when the damage is cosmetic or limited to a small dent, hinge, bracket, or weather seal. A broken garage door spring, damaged cable, bent track, detached roller, or loose support bracket should generally be treated as a safety issue.

Stop operating the door if it is hanging unevenly, has come off its tracks, makes a loud snap, or appears to be supported by only one cable. Keep children, pets, and vehicles clear of the area. Do not stand beneath a partially open door or attempt to force it closed with a damaged counterbalance system.

Door safety also includes the automatic reversal system. If the door does not reverse when it contacts an approved test object, or if the photo-eye sensors are misaligned, discontinue automatic operation until the system is inspected. A door that appears to work can still present a serious hazard if its safety features fail.



Why Is My Overhead Garage Door Jammed, Loud, or Uneven?

An overhead garage door can become stuck because of a broken spring, obstructed garage door tracks, a damaged roller, loose hinges, cable problems, or garage door alignment issues. A noisy garage door may have dry bearings, worn rollers, loose fasteners, or metal parts rubbing together.

An uneven garage door often indicates that one side is carrying more weight than the other. This can happen when a cable has slipped, a spring has failed, or a track has been bent. Garage door track repair may involve straightening or replacing a section, securing brackets, and correcting the door's alignment. Garage door roller replacement may be needed when rollers are cracked, seized, or worn flat.

Do not hammer a bent track back into place while the door is under tension. A technician should disconnect the opener when appropriate, secure the door, inspect the counterbalance system, and test manual movement before reconnecting automatic operation.

Photo-eye sensors near the floor may be blocked, dirty, or misaligned. Their indicator lights should normally show that the sensors are communicating. Do not bypass them; they are an important part of the automatic reversing mechanism.

Other causes include stripped gears, a failed logic board, broken drive components, or an aging opener motor. Garage door opener repair may be beneficial when the unit is relatively modern and the door itself is in good condition. If the motor is loud, unreliable, or lacks current safety features, replacement may offer a more practical solution.

Do I Need to Repair or Replace My Garage Door?

Choosing between repair and replacement depends on the severity of damage, the door's age, appearance, insulation, hardware condition, and expected future repairs. Repair is usually practical when the main structure is sound and the problem is limited to springs, cables, rollers, hinges, tracks, seals, or an opener.
