I have been on both sides of that moment, as a homeowner and as the person who has had to call a truck in a rush. 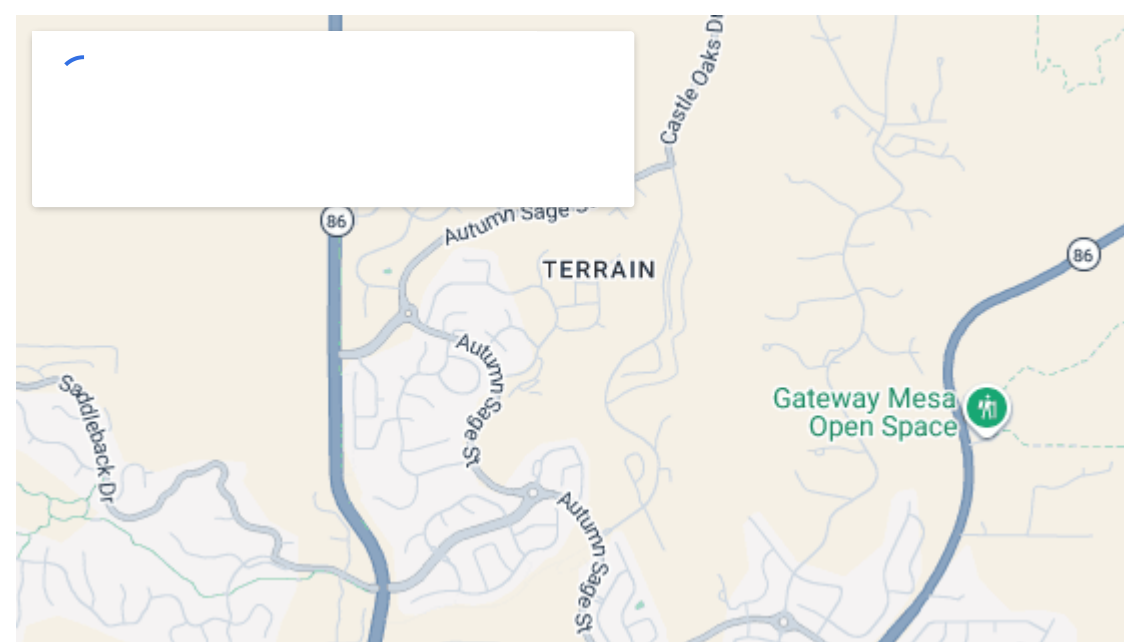
Smart questions to ask before you book

Reading a quote like a pro

They should decrease stirring the tank before the hose is in location. Excessive agitation without suction pulls solids towards the outlet. Do not assume all tanks equal. Newer plastic tanks can crack if a heavy truck parks above them. Old concrete tanks often have thin covers that can not be stood on.
