## **Zones, not arbitrary corners**

A backyard built for enjoyable features much less like a solitary space and more like a tiny resort. The most comfortable ones arrange area into a few clear areas that can interact for a large celebration or stand alone on a Tuesday evening.

Common areas that function well in domestic landscaping include:

- A key eating location with a table and proper chairs
- A lounge or fire attribute location for post-dinner conversation
- A food prep or grill station
- An open play or adaptable yard space

- A quiet yard corner for one or two people

A table half on yard and half on pavers, pressed up against a grill, with a narrow strip of grass by the back fence really feels littered. You ought to have the ability to lug a plate from the cooking area to the table without strange detours, irregular steps, or limited squeezes behind chairs. In higher end industrial landscape design, developers frequently soften concrete with spaced joints, exposed aggregate, or bands of contrasting product. 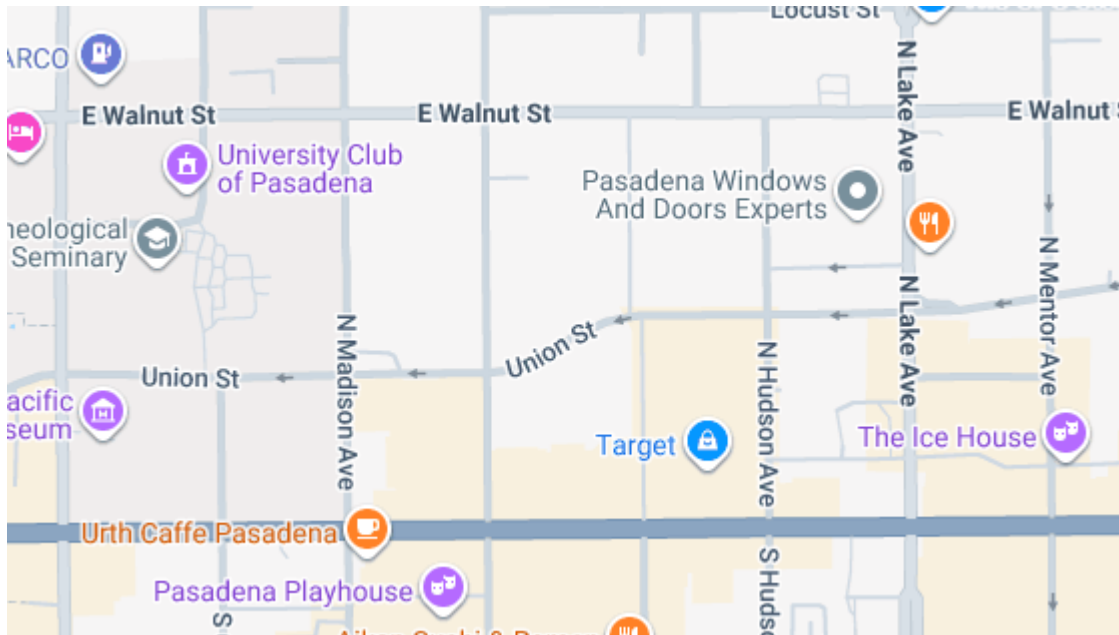
