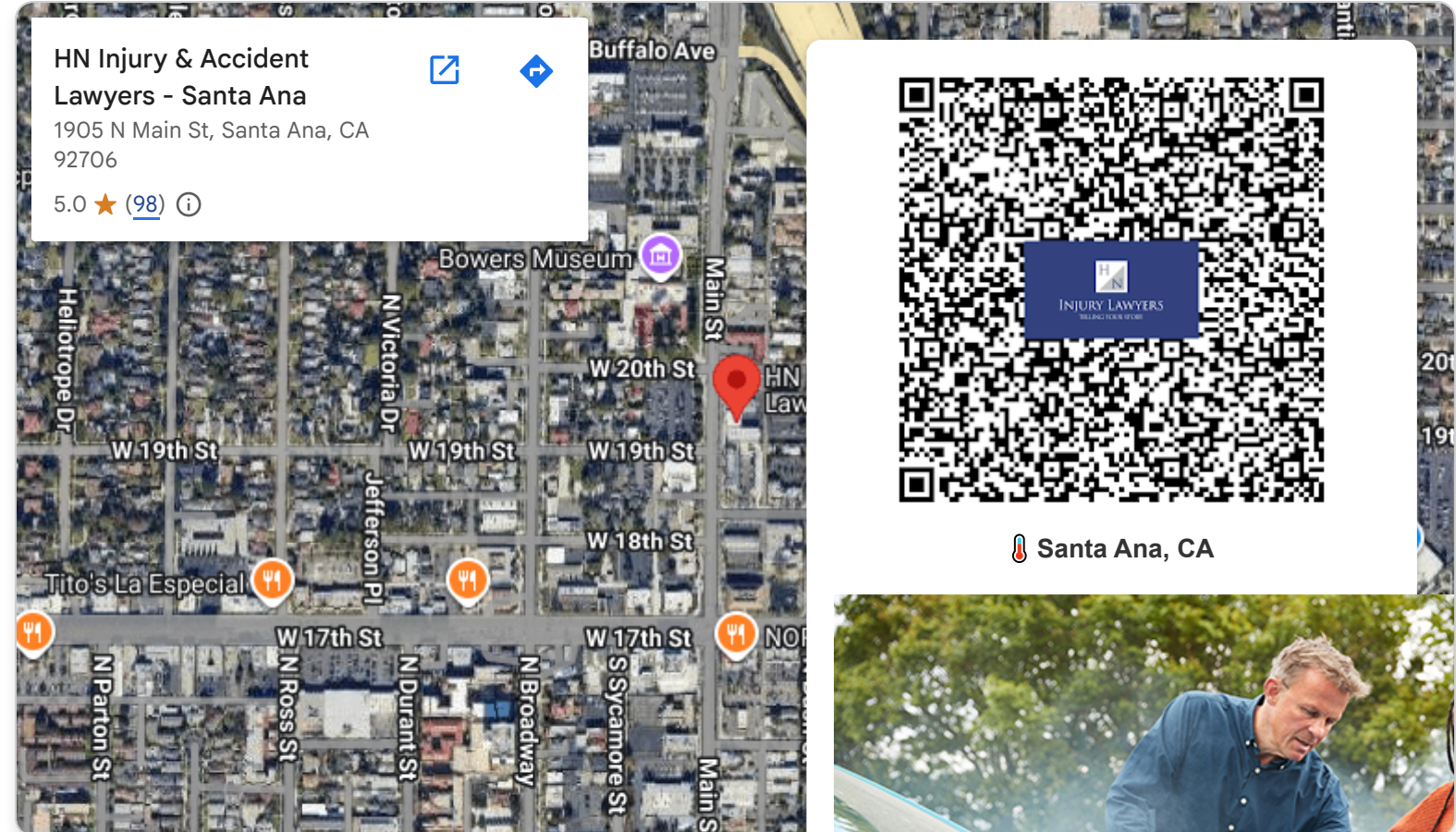

- A money or guaranty bond is a monetary bond where a defendant can be released by publishing the entire amount up front (cash money bond), or by working with a bondsman to post the bond for them, typically for a non-refundable fee.
- The District Attorney's Office have to generally submit charges within three business days of the apprehension when the accused is in custodianship, although an expansion of time can be granted by the court.
- If the judge identifies sufficient evidence exists, the felony case will be "bound over" to District Court for accusation.
- Offense instances are submitted and attempted in Denver Region Court.

A Preliminary Hearing is a "show cause" hearing, where the prosecution should encourage the court that there is probable reason that the person billed committed the charges submitted in the event. This is not a trial, and the concern on the prosecution is a lot reduced.
