Pricing models you will encounter

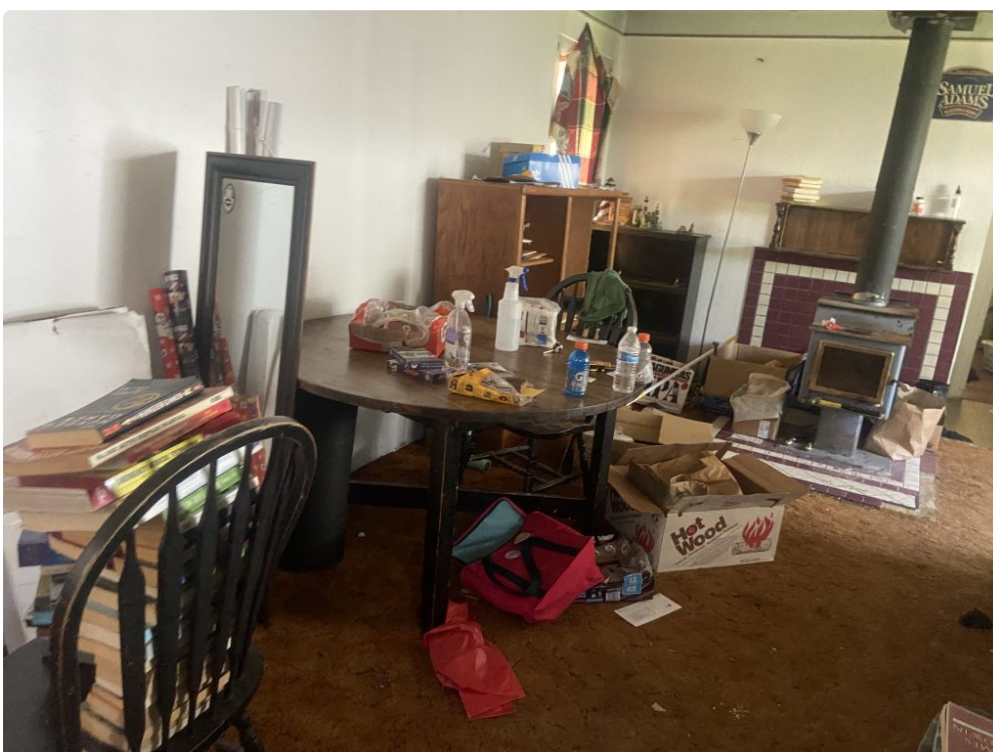

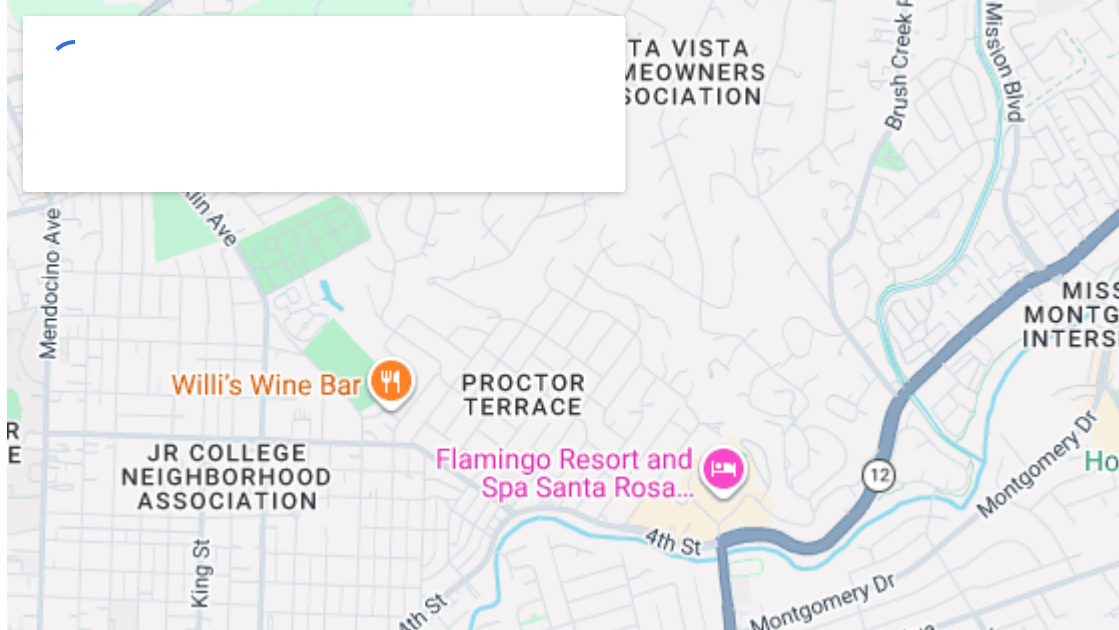

Red flags that should have a second thought
